| Additional activities | Physical Literacy/ Outdoors | Go for a walk outside in the community. Stop somewhere safe and close your eyes. What can you hear what is happening around you? Open your eyes and look around. Were you correct? Is there anything you missed? | Play hopscotch – Inside, use painters' tape on the floor to create your own board and use buttons or rolled up socks instead of rocks. Outside, use chalk to make a court and use rocks or the chalk itself as a marker. | Go outside and gather some rocks! Use a sharpie to write lowercase and/or uppercase letters on them. What words can you make? Perhaps, practicing and writing out the site words for this week. | ADST - use materials in your yard or outdoor space to create an obstacle course.
